Pt 3 amends the Health Protection (Notification) (Wales) Regulations 2010, which place obligations on various persons for the purpose of preventing, protecting against, controlling or providing a public health response to the incidence or spread of infection or contamination, to require diagnostic laboratories that process tests, and persons who carry out point of care tests, for the detection of severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) or influenza virus, to notify Public Health Wales National Health Service Trust of the results of those tests.

## **Written Statement: International Travel Changes**

A written statement by Eluned Morgan, Minister for Health and Social Services, announces the removal of Kenya, Oman, Turkey, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Maldives, Sri Lanka and Egypt from the COVID-19 red list. The changes will come into effect from 4.00 on 22 September 2021. The Welsh Government is also considering the UK Government's proposed changes to the border health measures, which include the removal of pre-departure testing and introducing lateral flow tests instead of PCR tests on day two of people's return to the UK.

In a written cabinet statement published alongside the guidance the Welsh Minister for Education asks that universities review their plans and review their risk assessments to reflect individual circumstance and national guidance.

These Regulations re-enact the Public Health (Protection from Eviction) (Wales) (Coronavirus) Regulations 2020, which expire on 11 January 2021.

The Health Protection (Coronavirus, International Travel) (Wales) Amendments

Members will be aware that the Welsh Government made provision in the Health Protection (Coronavirus, International Travel) (Wales) Regulations 2020 to ensure that travellers entering Wales from overseas countries and territories must isolate for 14 days and provide passenger information, to prevent the further spread of coronavirus. These restrictions came into force on 8 June 2020.
